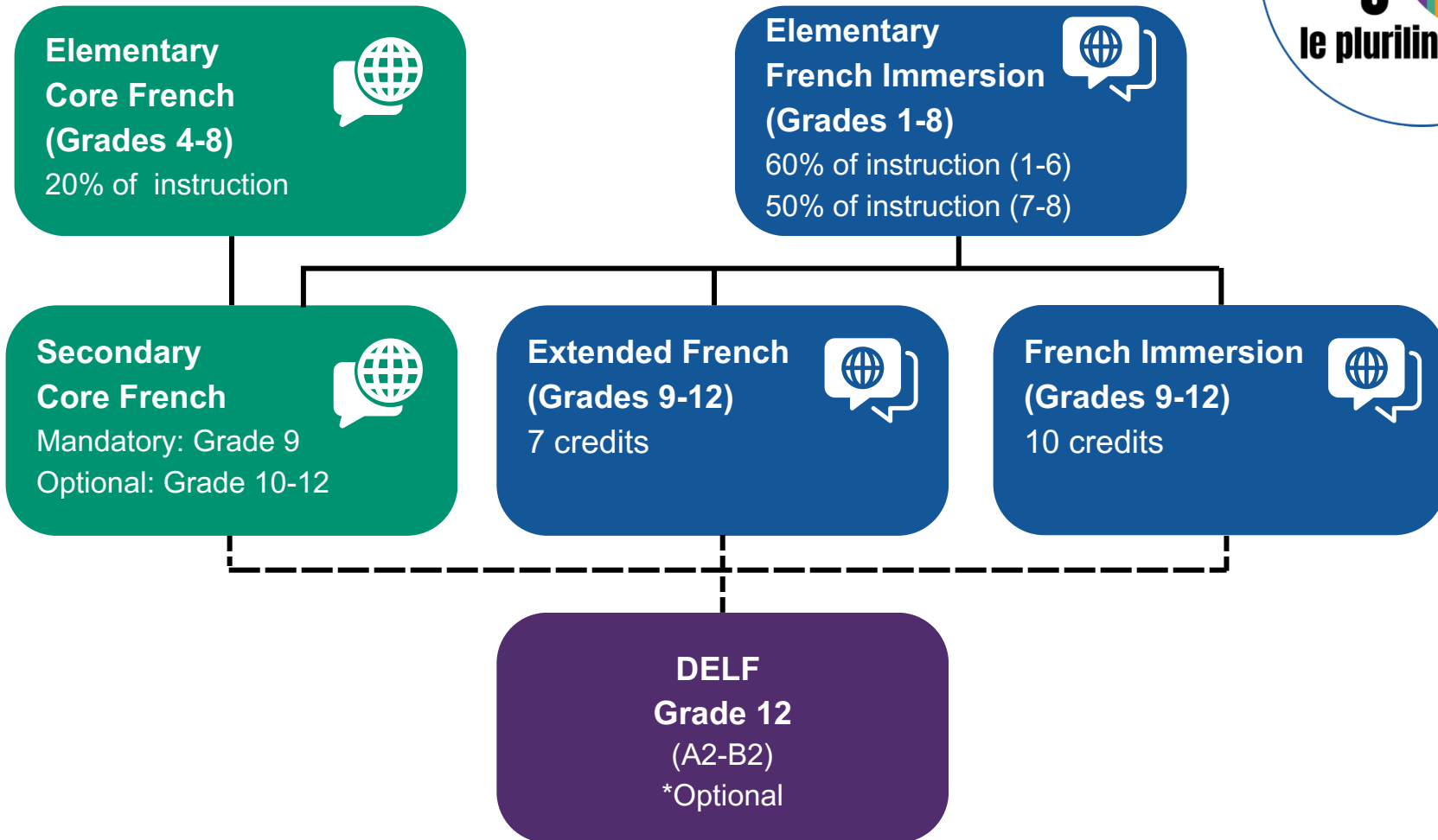
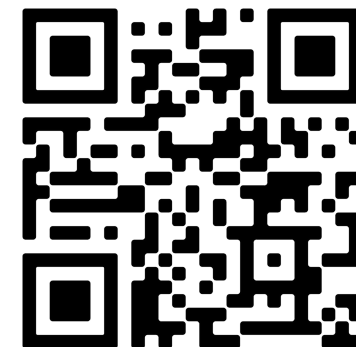

French Proficiency Diploma - DELF (Diplôme d'Études en langue française)

Earn a language diploma that is free and valid for life:

The DELF is an official French diploma funded by the Ministry of Education and recognized throughout the world. It certifies that the candidate has achieved a certain level of French proficiency and the diploma is valid for life. All Grade 12 students who are taking French as a Second Language can take the DELF exam with a choice of three levels.

Improve your resume and increase job opportunities after high school:

The DELF diploma is recognized by many administrative organizations, employers, and educational institutions, including European and Francophone universities.
