First Things First Graduation Requirements



- OSSD \rightarrow 30 Credits: a combination of 19 compulsory & 11 elective credits.
- OSSLT → Grade 10 Literacy Test
- Community Involvement Hours → 40 hours
- 2 e-Learning courses → students may opt out

Note: students can begin collecting hours in the summer after Grade 8. Hours are now entered online from the **HHS Website!**

In a regular year, students complete 8 credits over **2 semesters**:

- **Semester 1:** September January, 4 credits
- **Semester 2:** February June, 4 credits



What is the difference between PPL10 vs PAF10?



PPL1OR: Healthy Active Living

- Participate in a wide range of activities and movement skills;
- Cover topics related to health and wellness;
- Unit examples: badminton, volleyball, basketball, soccer, dance, games, fitness, swimming, yoga

PAF10R: Fitness

- Participate in a wide range of movement skills to improve personal fitness;
- Cover topics related to health and wellness
- Concentration on individual fitness activities such as weight training and aerobics,
 SMART goal setting, and personal fitness program design.

Certificate of Achievement in:

Core French: 4 French Language courses (FSF1D, FSF2D, FSF3U and FSF4U).

Immersion French: 10 courses in which the language of instruction is French; 4 of which must be Immersion French Language courses.


